I am thrilled to report that the 2017/18 fiscal year came with significant growth in the number of individuals and families in need for whom the Caring and Sharing Exchange (C&SE) provided relief and dignity through our programs.

Through the Sharing in Student Success Program, we provided assistance to all 2,553 children from families in need that were registered for the program. This assistance included a backpack stuffed with all the gradeappropriate supplies required for each child's grade level (as outlined by the Ottawa Boards of Education). This not only eased the tension on already extremely tight family budgets, but also allowed these children to return to school on an equal footing with their peers, ready to learn. This was no small feat. In the last 2 years, the need for this program has increased by 61.4%.

Through the Christmas Exchange Program, we were able to provide a record 17,351 individuals in need the opportunity to enjoy a festive holiday meal that otherwise would not have been possible. This represents an increase of 17.8% over the number of individuals we provided assistance to in the previous year. As always, my family enjoyed participating in the Corporate Hamper-Packing Day, where our corporate partners, volunteers, and community leaders came together to pack and deliver hundreds of hampers to Ottawa families in need in a single day.

In conjunction with both our assistance programs, the Caring and Sharing Exchange continues to run the Coordination Service, working to eliminate any duplication of service across the community. This year, the service saved the community \$69,900. Through this innovative service, the C&SE ensures that donor dollars go further and all savings are reinvested to help even more people in need.

The C&SE would not be able to help our neighbours in need without the generosity of all our donors, volunteers, partners, and community leaders. Thanks to these groups, we continue to make an incredible difference at both Christmas and during back-to-school.

It has been an absolute pleasure to have once again led a dedicated group of Board Directors over the past year. This year, we say goodbye to Brent Percival (Vice President), who joined the Board in 2013, and Cara Salci, who joined in 2014. Thank you to you both. It was a pleasure to work and serve with you over the past few years. You will surely be missed.

This year, I have also made the difficult decision to step down from the Board of Directors. I joined the Board of Directors in 2012, and have served as President of the Board for the past 2 years. I look forward to continuing to support the Caring and Sharing Exchange and its great work in a different capacity in the future. I know that I am leaving the organization in great hands.

During my time on the Board I have met, served and learned from many talented and generous people. I have also made many wonderful memories; from a very eventful first Annual General Meeting, volunteering at the Hope Beach Volleyball Tournament; packing Christmas Hampers with my girls and delivering them with my wife; and light moments with colleagues at Board and other meetings. All of this while helping individuals and families in need.

I am very proud to have been part of the Caring and Sharing Exchange and the great work we have done during my tenure. Thank you for one of the most fulfilling experiences of my life.

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Overall, this was a great year for the Caring and Sharing Exchange (C&SE) team and we are thrilled to report many successes in 2017.

Through both the Christmas Exchange and the Sharing in Student Success programs, we provided dignity, relief, and hope to 19,904 Ottawa individuals in need. This is an 18.6% increase over the previous year.

To ensure that we are helping those most in need, beginning in 2017, the C&SE requires that all individuals and families registered for assistance fall within the LICO (Low Income Cut-Off) Measure. In addition, we continue to make our donor's dollars go further through our innovative Coordination Service, by eliminating any duplicate applications for assistance.

Because many individuals and businesses alike prefer to give back to the community in a more tangible way, we have seen a significant increase in the number of in-kind donations we are receiving. Firstly, the Sponsor-a-Hamper Program allows individuals, families, groups, and businesses to put together a hamper and deliver it directly to a person or family in need. During the 2017 Christmas Exchange Campaign, 1,299 hampers were sponsored as opposed to 505 in 2016, an incredible 157.2% increase! Secondly, we are finding an increase in donations of backpacks and school supplies for the Sharing in Student Success Program. In fact, the value of materials donated was estimated at \$99,162, an increase of 97.9% over the previous year.

Once again, Kindness Week in Ottawa was a tremendous success. The theme was "Kinds of Kindness." We spent the week running around with the very kind Rabbi Bulka all in the name of kindness,

surprising the city's kindest individuals and groups with awards - 60 awards were given out! Many other activities were held across Ottawa, including: a launch event in Accora Village; a Multi-Faith Airport Welcoming Committee; a Kindness Week Blood Donor Clinic; and much more!

I want to thank our dedicated Board of Directors, our donors, our partner agencies, the staff, and the incredible volunteers that help us provide assistance to those in need. We could not do it without you!

In closing, I'd like to say a special thank you to our outgoing Board President, Paul Lalonde. Paul has put so much energy, heart, and soul into the Caring and Sharing Exchange over the past several years. On a personal note, Paul has been an incredibly supportive leader, a mentor, a sounding-board, and a pleasure to have worked with.

PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE: OUR PROGRAMS REPORT

THE CHRISTMAS EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Although Christmas is a joyous time for many of us, for those experience financial hardship, it can be a daunting and stressful time of year. In 2017, we had 17,877 individuals requesting assistance through the Christmas Exchange. Thanks to our generous donors and supporters, 17,351 individuals were provided with relief and dignity through a food hamper containing all the fixings for a festive Christmas dinner, or a with redeemable gift voucher.

We are so happy to report a tremendous growth in our Sponsor-a-Hamper program. In 2017, 1,299 families received assistance through Sponsor-a-Hamper—an increase of 88% from the year before! Our Corporate Hamper-Packing Day was also a huge success, with 407 hampers packed and delivered by wonderful volunteers all in a single day.

THE SHARING IN STUDENT SUCCESS PROGRAM (SISS)

In 2017, we had 2,553 children from Ottawa families in need register for our Sharing in Student Success (SISS) program. Despite a 23% increase in registration over the previous year, we are happy to report that every child registered for the program received assistance in the form of a backpack filled with all the grade-appropriate supplies they needed for the school year.

We continue to be blown away by the incredible support of our donors. retail partners, volunteers, and supporters for this important program.

THE COORDINATION SERVICE

During both our assistance programs, the Caring and Sharing Exchange ran its innovative 103-year-old Coordination Service! Through this important service, we worked with close to 250 agency partners to eliminate any duplicate applications for assistance city-wide. In fact, in just the last 5 years, our Coordination Service has **saved the community over \$2.5 million**. All savings are reinvested to help even more Ottawa individuals and families in need year after year.
