# THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

In 1914 as the First World War began, there was a resulting increase in the need for assistance within the city of Ottawa. In response to this, the local community came together to offer support at Christmas time to those who needed it. The following year the Christmas Exchange was created, giving an opportunity for individuals and organizations to provide Christmas cheer to those in need. The same year, the Ottawa Welfare Bureau set up a confidential index to coordinate relief to these families, by gathering information from those who were helping the less fortunate at this time. They created a master list for Christmas aid, allowing them to check for duplications so the community could help more people. One hundred years later, both our Christmas Exchange Program and the Coordination Service are alive and well, and we are thrilled to be celebrating our Centennial Anniversary in 2015!

This past year was a success for the Caring and Sharing Exchange, as over all through both our Christmas Exchange and Sharing in Student Success

Programs we were able to help 13,964 individuals in need. We are so grateful

to the thousands of generous individuals, groups and companies in our community that helped make this possible.

Along with the success of our assistance programs, we were also proud to once again host Kindness Week in Ottawa. The theme for Kindness Week 2015 (February 13 - 20, 2015) was recognizing the Kindness of Youth. I had the distinct pleasure of visiting schools with Rabbi Reuven Bulka to personally recognize and thank those Ottawa Youth who have chosen to be kind. I have no doubt that the future of our community is in good hands after hearing each and every inspirational story of kindness!

## PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE: OUR PROGRAMS REPORT

## THE CHRISTMAS EXCHANGE **PROGRAM**

During the excitement of the Christmas season, it is important to remember those individuals and families in need within our community. Each year the Caring and Sharing Exchange receives requests from thousands of individuals in need, more than half of which are children and seniors.

With the number of requests nearly equal to the maximum capacity of the Canadian Tire Centre, we rely on our generous donors, sponsors and volunteers to help us deliver Christmas to those less fortunate. In 2014, we were able to help a total of 12,445 individuals through the program.

A highlight of the program this year was our Hamper Packing Day, where hundreds of volunteers came together to pack and deliver more than 400 hampers to Ottawa families in need (an increase of 25% over last year). We were honoured to be joined by His

### THE SHARING IN STUDENT SUCCESS PROGRAM

In 2014, 1,519 children turned to the Sharing in Student Success (SISS) Program for assistance during the back-toschool season, which was an increase in need by almost 20% from the previous year.

Thanks to generosity of the community, the Caring and Sharing Exchange was once again able to meet the need and provide each and every one of those children with a backpack filled with all of the grade-appropriate school supplies they needed to succeed in the classroom.

## THE COORDINATION SERVICE

The backbone of the Caring and Sharing Exchange is the Coordination Service. This service began back in 1915, during the First World War, when the need for assistance was very high. It was realized that with so many kind community members hoping to help those in need, some form of central list was needed to ensure that help was distributed fairly. One hundred years later the service is alive and well and in working with over 200 partner agencies C&SE has saved the Ottawa community almost \$2 million dollars over the last three years by eliminating potential duplications in service. This allows donor dollars to go even further!

This new fundraiser involved members of the community purchasing lights for \$5 to light the Tree in support of the Christmas Exchange program. In fact, the original concept for this initiative was put forth by a former C&SE Board member, Thom Bourne, President & GM of Nutrilawn Ottawa. When the C&SE approached Mayor Watson with the initiative he immediately invited us to light his tree, prominently located right in front of City Hall!

## 2nd ANNUAL CORPORATE HAMPER PACKING DAY

The number of hampers packed and delivered on this single day represented an increase of 25% over the inaugural year.
