# **Mayor Jim Watson helps light the Caring Christmas Tree!**

This tree has been lit in stages as lights are purchased, and will be fully lit at this event.

The public is still encouraged to purchase lights after the lighting ceremony, leading up to Christmas Day. All of the funds raised will go directly towards providing food hampers or gift vouchers for Ottawa's individuals and families in need this holiday season.

The charity has received requests for assistance from more than 16,000 people in the Ottawa community, and with only nine days until Christmas there are still more than 3,000 names on the waiting list. Every light helps!
