



## Gearing Up for Another Year....

### Refugees Sharing in Student Success

As parents begin registering their children for our Sharing in Student Success (SISS) program for 2017, we reached out to Rukia Warsame, a settlement counsellor at the Somali Centre for Family Services. She was instrumental in helping the Somali Centre to become one of our partner agencies in 2011, and has distributed backpacks and school supplies to around 60 students every year since.

In 2016, the number of students referred to SISS through Rukia’s organization **grew fivefold**. This growth was directly attributed to the number of Syrian refugees seeking assistance at the Somali Centre.

“Last summer, we distributed **more than 300 backpacks** for over 100 households,” Rukia says. “As a settlement agency, the Somali Centre’s main target populations are the newcomers, according to funding mandate. However, we do not turn anyone away. We assist people through the challenges of their settlement.”

The feedback from the Centre’s clients has been overwhelmingly positive, and the Somali Centre is **grateful for the Ottawa community’s response** to the increase in need they’ve seen in the past year.

With **nearly 600 children** registered for SISS 2017 so far, and with immigration levels in 2017 already above those in previous years, it’s likely the need for SISS will be **even greater** this year. 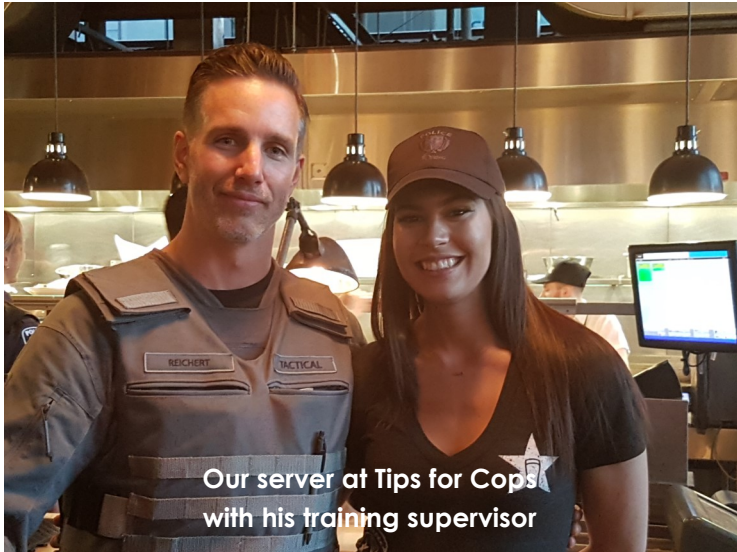
